

WHAT IS YOUR STORY?

EMBRACE THIS MUSIC AS YOUR OWN.

INSPIRATION FOR TRULY NATIONAL MUSIC MIGHT BE DERIVED FROM NEGRO MELODIES OR INDIAN CHANTS. I WAS LED TO TAKE THIS VIEW PARTLY BY THE FACT THAT THE SO-CALLED PLANTATION SONGS ARE INDEED THE MOST STRIKING AND APPEALING MELODIES THAT HAVE YET BEEN FOUND ON THIS SIDE OF THE WATER, BUT LARGELY BY THE OBSERVATION THAT THIS SEEMS TO BE RECOGNIZED, THOUGH OFTEN UNCONSCIOUSLY, BY MOST AMÉRICANS.

ENCOURAGEMENT: WENED THIS MUSIC

PERFORMANCE: ITEMS TO CONSIDER

- BE ENCOURAGED TO ADJUST YOUR OPINION & PEDAGOGY AS YOU LEARN
- INVEST TIME IN SCHOLARSHIP TO PREPARE DISCUSSION AND PROVIDE CONTEXT TO YOUR SINGERS
- STRIVE TO PROVIDE MORE THAN IS EXPECTED. DON'T ASSUME THAT THEY KNOW AND UNDERSTAND CONTEXT (EXAMPLES—SLAVE TRADE TRIANGLE, THE SLAVE BIBLE, ETC)
- TUNES WERE "COLLECTED" AND WRITTEN DOWN (BEG. 1867)
- MANY VARIATIONS EXIST OF THE SAME TUNE OR TEXT
- MANY SONGS INCLUDED CODED LANGUAGE




